## ORDER

1. This Court, *vide* order dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2023, on a joint request made by the parties, appointed Ms. Gauri Puri, Advocate, as a Court Commissioner for inspecting nine dairy colonies, which are subject matter of present writ petition. Ms. Puri caried out inspection in presence of the parties, including the officials of Municipal Corporation of Delhi ('MCD') and filed a detailed report. The report reveals violation of the provisions of (a) Prevention of





Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960 and the Rules framed thereunder; (b) Guidelines for Environmental Management of Dairy Farms and Gaushalas published by the Central Pollution Control Board in July, 2021; (c) Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974; (d) Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981; (e) Delhi Municipal Corporation Act, 1957; (f) Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986; and (g) Cattle Premises

- Registration Rules, 1978.

  2. The learned Court Commission shall furnish a copy of the to all Respondents. Since the joint inspection was carried out in the presence of the MCD officials, it is evident that they are aware about the violations which were observed and recorded by Ms. Puri. In fact, Mr. Manu
- Chaturvedi, learned counsel appearing for the MCD assures that they will take strict action on the basis of the report submitted by the learned Court

Commissioner.

3. We have perused the report and are appalled by the observations contained and the pictures annexed therewith, which depict poor hygienic conditions and the health of the milch animals. Solid waste comprising of empty plastic bottles, wet waste from cattle, medicine bottles and used syringes is overflowing in and around the dairy colonies. The milk containers and cattle-feed are kept uncovered, exposed to flies and waste around it. Most dairy units are extremely hot and humid, with no functional ventilation facilities. The calves were malnourished, ill, and separated from their mothers. Short ropes were tied tightly around their necks, severely restricting the movement of the animals; the dairy units were overcrowded and in some instances the cows were tied outside the dairy colonies on the roads. The extraction of milk twice a day, which was done using injections

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of an unidentified transparent liquid, in the presence of a stuffed head of a

dead calf, and the learned Court Commissioner notes that this was the only

life that the animals were subjected to.

4. In light of the egregious violations noted above, the following directions

are passed:

(a) Respondents shall take appropriate action on the basis of the report

submitted by learned Court Commissioner, ensure that the dairies are

compliant with the extant laws, and file an action-taken report within three

months of the date of this order.

(b) Copies of such reports shall also be supplied to the Court Commissioner.

(c) Ms. Puri is requested to carry out a fresh joint inspection after three

months and submit a fresh report within four weeks thereafter. She is also

requested to verify the contents of the aforementioned action-taken reports

filed by the Respondents and record her findings in her report.

5. This Court is appreciative of the hard work put in by learned Court

Commissioner, and in fact, Mr. Vivek Sibal, learned Senior Counsel for the

Petitioner, has volunteered that they shall make interim payments to Ms.

Puri Rs. 25,000/- for each inspection carried out by her.
